

Winter Management Plan

Objective	Responsibility for salting and gritting roads and pavements rests with WSCC, however they have to prioritise when the weather deteriorates and they depend upon local residents to take responsibility for maintaining access within their Village. The focus of the Horsted Keynes Winter Management Plan is on maintaining access to the Village (buses, deliveries such as heating oil / food etc. and emergency vehicles) and ensuring that people can safely move about the main areas of the Village. The Parish Council (as a Corporate body) is unable to undertake snow / ice clearance as its only employees are the Clerk and RFO and it does not employ any maintenance staff. However, it acts as liaison between residents and WSCC when weather conditions are adverse.

Bulk Bags – No additional delivery Winter 2016.17

Point of Contact: Co-ordinator and Clerk (Parish Office)

Area to be treated: Village centre and dangerous bend in road at Beggars Pit, Birchgrove Road

Method to be used to treat area: Hand spreading

Spread Rate: 20g. per square metre

4 x "Snow Clearance Kits" consisting of a snow shovel, hi-viz vest, warm hat and gloves and emergency blankets are held by the Council and are for use by Volunteers helping to clear snow from footpaths and other priority areas.
